The timescale for these risks is largely dependent on the scale of the benefit shortfall, with low reductions in benefit due to the spare room subsidy likely not to impact for 6 months to a year from now. Those affected by the Welfare Benefit Cap are likely to face a larger income reduction, some facing a weekly shortfall of over £100 per week. In these cases the risk of homelessness is likely to occur within a shorter timescale, for some this could be within a three month period, unless preventative action is taken. The Housing Provision Service is working with DWP officers to visit all households affected by the Welfare Cap. Where there is no immediate solution (such as when a household is not 'work ready' as they do not have the skills for employment or cannot move to cheaper accommodation straight away) households are encouraged to apply for Discretionary Housing Payments (DHP) although this is temporary solution (generally available for a period of six months to a year).  Tenants affected by the social housing spare room subsidy can also apply for Discretionary Housing Payments whilst they look to downsize into smaller homes. The Council also prioritises Housing Register applicants applying to the Sponsored Moves scheme and looking to downsize for re-housing. With the introduction of Universal Credit (date yet to be confirmed by central government) the Housing Benefit element of Universal Credit will be paid directly to tenants rather than to housing associations. Housing associations are concerned they will see an increase in rent arrears as a result. This reform may also therefore lead to risks of increased homelessness, if more tenants get into rent arrears.

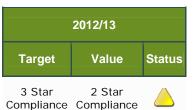

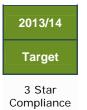
